
WORLD BANK EMERGENCY SUPPORT IN UKRAINE: PROCUREMENT OPPORTUNITIES



Repairing Essential Logistics Infrastructure and Network Connectivity (RELINC) Project

Project - P180318

26% of Ukraine's Area Affected, Including Critical Corridors for Imports & Exports



- 12% bridge infrastructure
- o 19% railway infrastructure & assets
- 2,100 villages, 51 towns, & 35 cities in returned territories affected by disrupted transport networks
- Demand for transport services fallen by ~30% between 2021 and 2022
- Additional 88 rail stations, over 400 railway bridges and over 350 road bridges damaged in Donetska, Luhanska, Zaporizka, Khersonska, and Kharkivska oblasts since June 2022

RELINC Context and Scope of Activities

Approved in February 2023; Effective in June 2023 Currently in active implementation stage



- \$92bn in reconstruction/recover needs in railway infrastructure and rolling stock (30%), national roads (29%), and local roads (16%)
- Over \$20bn of transport sector losses estimated from disrupted Black Sea port access
- Additional 88 rail stations, over 400 railway bridges and over 350 road bridges damaged in Donetska, Luhanska, Zaporizka, Khersonska, and Kharkivska oblasts since June 2022

PDO:	Provide means for mitigating immediate impact that disrupted transport networks have on Ukraine's population & economy.
Total funding needs:	US\$585 million
Initial funding available:	US\$50 million from URTF signed
	Additional US\$225 million under processing
Current Funding Gap:	US\$310 million

Components:

- 1. Lifeline road connections (\$23.5m funded; estimated need ~\$289m): provision of modular bridges for immediate and urgent repairs to restore damaged road network, materials for emergency road repairs during winter, and equipment to enhance western road Border Crossing Points (BCPs) to mitigate impacts of Black Sea disruption.
- 2. Lifeline rail connections (\$23.5m funded; estimated need ~\$289m): procurement of components for production of flatbed railway wagons, modular bridges, equipment, and materials to repair damaged rail connections, and rolling stock urgently needed to support export of Ukraine's agricultural commodities via EU ports.
- 3. Readiness for Urgent Reconstruction Initiatives and Project Management (\$3m funded; estimated need ~\$7m): support for technical studies for future recovery projects and for project supervision and monitoring.

RELINC: Scope Adjusted to Respond to New Emerging Needs and Priorities of the Sector



- Project served as a platform enabling mobilization of support from donors to address identified needs: modular bridges needs being met outside of project by donors/IFIs and around 700m are in procurement under RELINC.
- Other needs met (materials road and bridge repairs and BCPs) by IFIs/donors and state budget.
- Project to continue support for rolling stock to improve operational efficiency of railways: shunting locomotives to enhance resilience and efficiency of shunting operations.
- With **termination of BSGI**, Danube riverports cluster became critical alternatives to transport Ukraine's agriculture produce, requiring increase in their cargo handling capacity.
- To meet new needs, new component will support procurement of navigation (personal pilot kits and automated traffic management system) and transloading equipment (wheel loaders and portal crane), vessels (tug-boats), & materials for infrastructure repairs for improving operational capacity at Danube riverports.

Restoration Project of Winterization and Energy Resources Ukraine (REPOWER)

Project - P180332

More than Half of the Energy Facilities Damaged due to Targeted Attacks

Energy represents 8% of total damage (US\$10.6 billion) as of February 2023

Power Sector Damage is the largest: US\$ 6.5 bn

Actual damage is larger, but it cannot be quantified due to limited access to the war zone and occupied territories in Eastern and Southern regions

RE-POWER Context and Scope of Activities

Approved in April 2023; Effective in July Currently in active implementation stage



- High voltage transformers in critical substations particularly targeted, causing rolling blackouts across the country
- o Revenue losses in power, gas production, gas transit, coal mining, and fuel oil sectors of over \$27bn
- District heating distribution damages in the Southern and Eastern regions caused evacuation as neither restoration nor reconstruction is feasible

To enable the restoration of essential energy services in Ukrai	ne.
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- Total funding needs: US\$500 million
- Initial funding available: US\$200 million from URTF signed
- Current Funding Gap: \$300 million

Components:

PDO:

- 1. Emergency equipment for the electricity transmission infrastructure (\$199.7m funded; estimated need ~\$300m): provision of autotransformers, transformers, circuit breakers, and other substation equipment and materials for Ukrenergo. This is the most critical support to restore the electricity supply for the entire transmission network.
- 2. Emergency equipment for the heating infrastructure (\$0m funded; estimated need ~\$200m): provision of mobile heat-only boilers for heating centers, mobile mini co-generation units, other equipment and materials for repairing district heating and gas networks as well as liquid fuel depots and alternative heating options.
- 3. Project Management and Monitoring (\$0.3m funded): project supervision and monitoring support

RE-POWER: Scope Has Been Adjusted Responding to Dynamic Situation on Damages & Donor Support

- Framework approach demonstrated overall needs and financing gap helping mobilize resources from other donors.
- Most of the needs for autotransformers met by various donors, while RePOWER contributing to procurement of 6 units.
- While needs for autotransformers are mostly met, needs for remaining critical equipment for repairing electricity and district heating infrastructure remain unmet. Needs have emerged to protect autotransmofers and infrastructure.
- Project is being adjusted to support remaining and emerging needs, including facilities to protect new and existing autotransformers.

Housing Repair for People's Empowerment Project (HOPE)

Project - P181200

HOPE Context and Scope of Activities

Project Approved On August 30, 2023, Effective as of October 18, 2023



- Housing is the most affected sector with total damage estimated at over \$50bn
- Est. 6 million people displaced within Ukraine
- o 1.45 million residential units (~11% of total residential stock) impacted directly affecting ~3.5 million residents
- ~87% of housing units damaged are in multi-family apartment buildings
- 4 out 5 damaged units are in urban areas

PDO:	To support affected households to regain adequate housing through repair of damaged housing
	stock and to support national government in priority policy reform areas.
Total funding needs:	US\$800 million
Funding mobilized:	US\$232.5 million

Components:

- 1. Repair of damaged residential units: community grants for minor and medium repairs of damaged (<40% damage) residential units.
- 2. Preparation for, and capital repair of medium damaged residential units: funding of engineering and design documents for and repairs of up to moderately damaged (10-40%) multi-apartment residential buildings.

HOPE Ukraine: Implementation Progress

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Component 1:

- ~60,000 applications for compensations submitted
- ~30,000 applications or US\$80 million approved for payments
- **US\$100 million** is expected to be paid to the endbeneficiaries by the end of CY2023

Component 2:

- City selection criteria is under the final stages
- In each participating city a cluster of buildings with medium damages will be selected for rehabilitation

Preparation of detailed design documentation for rehabilitation/restoration of multi-family buildings with partial/medium damages.	Cumulative of USD 10 million
